LIGHTING THE ADVENT WREATH Scott Brogan & Barbara Wimer

> The birth of Jesus has been told and retold a thousand times and in a thousand ways. Its impact cannot be contained in any one perspective. But who is telling the story changes how we hear it, how we imagine it, how we experience it. We light the candle of hope because hope creates a path for a new, unknown story to unfold.

The first Advent candle is lit.

Close your eyes for a moment. What we often see this side of history in paintings or nativities is a peaceful still life of the blessed family, Mary, Joseph, and the baby Jesus. Imagine visiting the newborn infant.

Open your eyes. Babies are not always quiet. If something is wrong or they need attention, they cry out regardless of what anyone else is saying or doing. Those around the baby must choose to respond to their cries.

The same is true for injustice. When needs go unmet or injustice occurs, the cries of those affected rise in hopes of being heard by those nearby. A cry is a call for peace. Peace in an unfed belly, peace for safety and security, peace to be clean and have dignity. The infant Jesus broke the silence, crying out to bring peace to the world. Jesus, like Malachi, John, and other prophets before him, calls us in the loudest of cries to peace.

Today, we also light the candle of peace because peace requires us to pay attention to the needs of those around us.

The second Advent candle is lit.
