



The Cross Before Me...

IMPOSITION OF ASHES

*The use of ashes as a sign of mortality and repentance has a long history in Jewish & Christian worship, and this ritual is a powerful nonverbal and experiential way of participating in the call to repentance and reconciliation. Last year’s palm branches from Palm Sunday have been burnt to produce the ashes used in tonight’s service. You are invited to come forward as you feel comfortable and receive the sign of the cross on your forehead or your hand, reflecting on the words:*  
*“Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Repent, and believe the gospel.”*
